3. Your favourite film?


I don't really watch TV but maybe something like Superbad always is a favourite of mine



Youghal Ladies Gaelic Football Club is delighted to announce details of their 2<sup>nd</sup> Gaelic4Girls programme that is commencing on Friday May 1<sup>st</sup> in Magniers Hill. Gaelic4Girls is initially an 8 week programme aimed at increasing participation in Ladies Gaelic Football. The programme targets girls aged between 8-12 years who are not currently registered with a Ladies Gaelic Football Club or who have just recently taken up the sport.

Gaelic4Girls is focused on fun and participation, allowing girls to get an introduction to Ladies Gaelic Football in a non-competitive environment. It will be held in Magniers Hill every Friday from 6:30 – 7:30pm, commencing on May 1st. On completion of the programme, participants are presented with certificates and a jersey for their participation.
